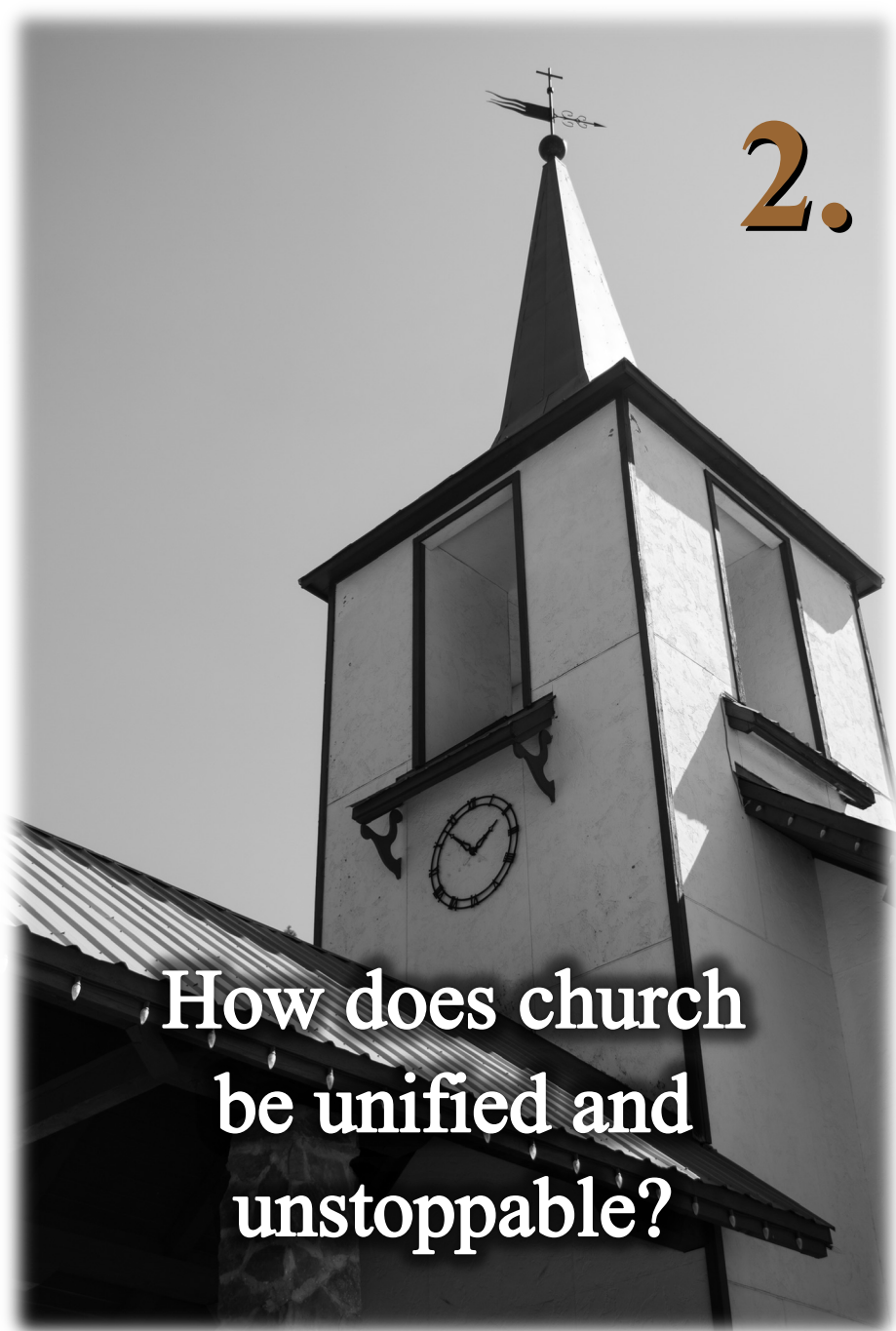

Being Honest with Each Other

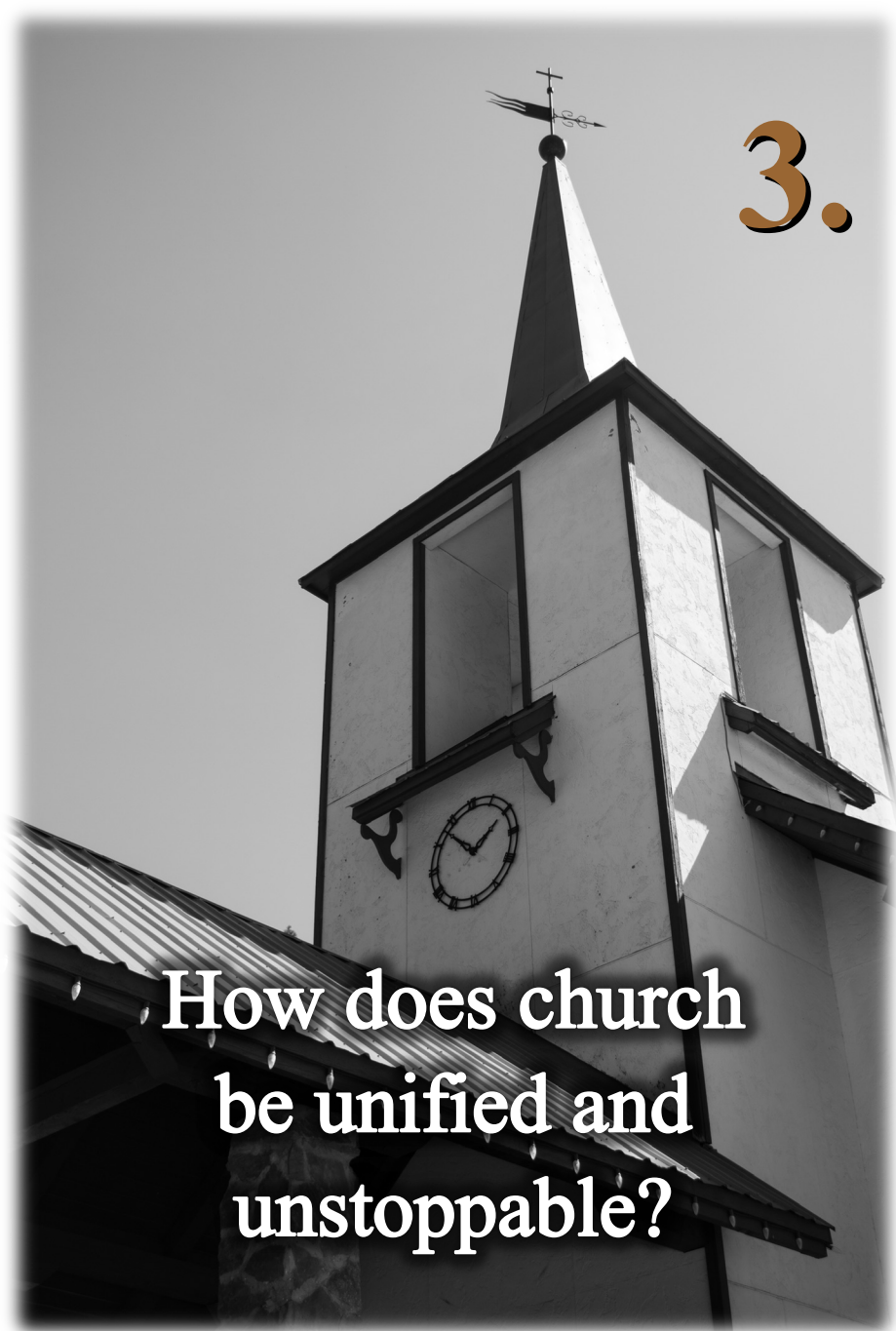
“Therefore, each of you must put off falsehood and speak truthfully to your neighbor, for we are all members of one body.”

Church Discipline

“¹⁵If a brother or sister sins, go and point out the fault, just between the two of you. If they listen to you, you have won them over. ¹⁶But if they will not listen, take one or two others along, so that ‘every matter may be established by the testimony of two or three witnesses.’”

Church Discipline

“¹⁷If they still refuse to listen, tell it to the church; and if they refuse to listen even to the church, treat them as you would a pagan or a tax collector.
