1. Slavery



2. Judgment

- Ex.6:6 – Say therefore to the Israelites, ‘I am the LORD, and I will free you from the burdens of the Egyptians and deliver you from slavery to them. I will redeem you with an outstretched arm and with mighty acts of judgment.
- Ex.15:6 – Your right hand, O LORD, glorious in power, your right hand, O LORD, shattered the enemy.
- Ex.12:12 – For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the LORD.



3. Revelation – for Pharaoh

- Ex.5:2 – But Pharaoh said, “Who is the LORD, that I should heed him and let Israel go? I do not know the LORD, and I will not let Israel go.”
- Ex.9:14 – For this time I will send all my plagues upon you yourself [pharaoh], and upon your officials, and upon your people, so that you may know that there is no one like me in all the earth.

3. Revelation – for Israelites

- Ex.6:7 – I will take you [Israelites] as my people, and I will be your God. You shall know that I am the LORD your God, who has freed you from the burdens of the Egyptians.
- Ex.10:1-12 – Then the LORD said to Moses, “Go to Pharaoh; for I have hardened his heart and the heart of his officials, in order that I may show these signs of mine among them, ² and that you may tell your children and grandchildren how I have made fools of the Egyptians and what signs I have done among them—so that you may know that I am the LORD.”

3. Revelation – for Egyptians

- Ex.7:5 – the Egyptians shall know that I am the LORD, when I stretch out my hand against Egypt and bring the Israelites out from among them.”
- Ex.14:4 – I will harden Pharaoh’s heart, and he will pursue them, so that I will gain glory for myself over Pharaoh and all his army; and the Egyptians shall know that I am the LORD. And they did so.

4. Goal

- Ex.3:12 – He said, “I will be with you; and this shall be the sign for you that it is I who sent you: when you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall worship [serve] God on this mountain.”
- Ex.29:45-46 – I will dwell among the Israelites, and I will be their God. And they shall know that I am the LORD their God, who brought them out of the land of Egypt that I might dwell among them; I am the LORD their God.
- Ex.25:21-22 – You shall put the mercy seat on the top of the ark; and in the ark you shall put the covenant that I shall give you. There I will meet with you (also Ex.30:6)

1. Slavery

- John 8:34 – everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin
- Eph.2:1-2 – You were dead through the trespasses and sins in which you once lived, following the course of this world, following the ruler of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work among those who are disobedient.
- Eph.6:12 – For our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places

2. Judgment

- God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do: by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, and to deal with sin, he condemned sin in the flesh
- Col.2:15 –He disarmed the rulers and authorities and made a public example of them, triumphing over them in it



3. Revelation

- Isa.53:1 – Who has believed what we have heard? And on whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed?
- John 1:14 – And the Word became flesh and lived [tented] among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.
- John 17:25-26 – “Righteous Father, the world does not know you, but I know you; and these know that you have sent me. ²⁶ I made your name known to them, and I will make it known, so that the love with which you have loved me may be in them, and I in them.”

4. Goal

- Gal.5:1 – For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery.
- Rom.3:23–25 – since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement [mercy seat] by his blood, effective through faith.
