Deck Discussion Questions

Coming Together: What is the best advice a leader has ever given you? What is the best advice you have ever given?

Growing in Our Understanding: Read Joshua 1:10-18. What were the key characteristics that united the people under Joshua's leadership and prepared them to conquer the land? How do the people respond to Joshua's challenge (see vv. 16-18)? If you have any questions about Joshua 1:1-18, write them down. Where can you discover the answers?

<u>Unwrapping God's Principles</u>: What was the Israelites responsibility in obtaining the land (1:2, 7-18)? How does this relate to our ability to experience God's promises in our day to day lives (see Hebrews 4:11, 6:9-12)? Read Joshua 1:13 and Psalm 95:7-11. What kept the wilderness generation from experience "rest in God"? How can we experience "rest in God" today? (Ps. 62:1-2)

<u>Influencing Our World</u>: What can we do in our day to day lives to prepare ourselves to experience the promises of God? How might Joshua 1:16-18 provide an example of how we should interact with our leaders?

<u>Deepening Our Hearts for God</u>: How well are you carrying out God's commands and acting on His promises? Which have been particularly difficult to follow this last week? How can someone help?

Looking Ahead: Read Joshua 2:1-24. Who are the people God uses to accomplish His purposes in this passage? What characteristics make them likely or unlikely instruments for God to use If you are reading through Joshua then read chapters 5-6 this week.
