How can we turn tragedies into triumphs?

1. Victory comes when I have faith in God's Word. (Joshua 8:1-2)

What has led to Joshua's discouragement?

Encouragement from God

- Sometimes... corrects
 "Do not be afraid....Do not be discouraged." (8:1a)
- Sometimes... directs
 "Take the whole army with you, and go up and attack...." (8:1b)
- Sometimes ... affirms

 "For I have delivered into your hands...." (8:1c)

"²For we also have had the gospel preached to us, just as they did,; but the message they heard was of no value to them **because those who heard did not combing it with faith**. ³Now we who have believed enter that rest."

2. Victory comes when I <u>obey God's plan</u>.
(Joshua 8:3-29)

Characteristics of God's Plans

- Requires us to keep the big picture is in focus
- Require us to listen to Him
- Requires our participation
- 3. Victories comes when I <u>give myself to God</u>. (Joshua 8:30-35)

Giving myself to God is something...

- ... initiated by my worship (Joshua 8:30)
- ... involves my total self (Joshua 8:31; Romans 12:1-2)
- ... includes my praíse (Joshua 8:30)
- ... includes my community (Joshua 8:33)
