- Read Acts 5:1-11. How did Ananias' and Sapphira's real estate transaction and donation compare with Barnabus'?

- What can we learn about church discipline from Matthew 18:15-20?

- What was the impact on the church and community to the discipline experienced by Ananias and Saphira (see Acts 5:5, 11, 42)?
