

Galatians 2:1-2




How <u>religious</u> does someone need to be to become a Christian?

"Yet not even Titus, who was with me, was compelled to be circumcised, even though he was a Greek."


Galatians 2:3

If it is no longer important, celebrate it and conclude it






There is a <u>commission</u> to be fulfilled.
