1. Recognize <u>their rebellion</u>

"The younger one said to his father, 'Father, give me my share of the estate.' So, he divided his property between them." Luke 15:12

Rebellion is...ínevítable and unpredictable Romans 3:23; Ephesians 6:4; Proverbs 22:6

What do I do when my adult child rebels?

• Let them... 90

Proverbs 22:6 "Not long after that, the younger son got together all he had, set off for a distant country..." Luke 15:13

• Let them... make their own mistakes Proverbs 20:30

"...and there squandered his wealth in wild living." Luke 15:13

• Let them... reap the consequences Galatians 6:7

"After he had spent everything, there was a severe famine in that whole country, and he began to be in need." Luke 15:14
