Remembering #6 in a Series on Victorious Living, Joshua 4:1-24

A God Moment

"15 Now the Jordan is <u>at flood stage</u> all during harvest. Yet as soon as the priests who carried the ark reached the Jordan and their feet touched the water's edge, ¹⁶ the water from upstream stopped flowing. It piled up in a heap a great distance away..." Joshua 3:15-16 (NIV)

"... These stones are to be a memorial to the people of Israel forever." (4:7)

A memorial is not an <u>altar of worship</u> or <u>shrine of superstition</u>. A memorial is a <u>reminder</u> of who God is, what He has promised and how He wants us to live.

When we memorialize those God moments...

1. We combat our own forgetfulness.

"Each of you is to take up a stone on his shoulder... 6 to serve as a sign among you." (Joshua 4:5-6)

What other signs in the Bible has God given us?

Noah (Gen. 9:13)...

Abraham (Gen. 17:11)...

Moses (Ex. 13:21, 31)...

In 1 Cor. 11:24-25...

In Matthew 28:19...

In the Book of Acts...

2. We take responsibility to teach future generations.

"In the future, when your children ask you, 'What do these stones mean?" (4:6, 21)

3. We honor what God has done.

"For the LORD your God dried up the Jordan before you until you had crossed over..." (4:23)

4. We give others an opportunity to hear.

"He did this so that <u>all the peoples of the earth might know</u> that the hand of the LORD is powerful" (4:24)

5. We express our <u>fear of God</u>.

"...and so that you might always fear the LORD your God." (4:24)

Remember, when building a memorial...

- ...it *does not* have to be elaborate.
- ...it does have to remind you of an important lesson.
- ...it *should not* point to us but to God.
- ...it should remind us of a truth worth repeating.
